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Project in Focus – Skyliner Quay Wall (S1 Developments)

Southbay are currently tasked with the construction of a new quay wall approximately 115m in length, which forms part of a new commercial development on the outskirts of Edinburgh. Initial works included installing sheet piles directly in front of an existing timber jetty. This will allow for the demolition of the jetty before backfilling the area behind the new quay wall. A total of 60no. 610mm diameter anchor piles will be installed complete with tie bars, providing the required anchorage to the new quay wall. Further works will include constructing a concrete coping above the sheet piled wall, and the provision of a new area of hard standing.

'A proactive approach to working in and around the existing jetty, for which little information was available, has ensured we remain on course to deliver this prestigious scheme in line with our clients programme. This excellent achievement has been achieved whilst encountering challenging ground conditions and high wind speeds. Rod Milne, Contracts Manager

Prince Charles Wharf Fenders (Port of Dundee)	£400k	The replacement of 21no. fenders across the length of the quay, including backing plates and packers.
Endeavour Wharf Remedial Works (Scarborough Council)	£390k	Strengthening of the upper section of sheet piling which forms an existing quay wall, and the replacement of timber fendering.
Isle of Man Ferry Landings (Peel Ports)	£350k	Repair works to concrete and steelwork elements of the landing stage to alleviate corrosion and ensure structural integrity.

Tilbury Fenders No.4 & No.5 (Port of Tilbury)	£170k	The replacement of two existing V Fenders complete with panels and fixing chains, forming part of the upper lead in jetty.
Marine Terminal Anode Installation (International Nuclear Services)	£155k	The removal of existing anodes, painting of the quay wall, and the installation of 168no. client supplied anodes.
